Awareness Of Your Dog's Nutritional Needs

For everybody who is buying a pet dog and / or puppy dog for the very first time then congratulations! This is usually a joyful and fascinating time for yourself and all your family members. A new puppy is really a good family pet as well as a brilliant companion for his keeper. They will bring huge enjoyment to a family home and therefore the trusted owner should take time to give just as much back to the pet just as they receive from him or her. Despite this being an exciting time you will really need to take the opportunity to take into consideration the new pet's nutritional needs. Giving your pet the correct sorts of food is going to have a big effect on his or her health, the eyes, pores and skin and coat so you have to get it right.

If your new canine friend is a little puppy you need to get hold of a premium [puppy food](#). This is not a trick – pups have completely different nutritional requirements to that of more mature dogs, requiring greater amounts of protein and fats mainly because they're extremely active in addition to growing at a speedy rate. Dry dog food is certainly perfect for your four-legged friend, but if it's too hard at this particular young age you can always put in a little tepid to warm water to make the dry food softer. Initially, your pup needs between 4-6 meals on a daily basis. It lessens to 3 to 4 bowls when the pup reaches 3 months old. When your dog gets to his or her first birthday milestone two dishes every day really should be adequate.

From 1 year you can make the switch to a grown-up [dry dog food](#). It's also possible to begin to give treats for instance gnaw sticks and chew bones. But, never give left over bone from poultry or lamb. These kinds of bones are small and therefore can choke the dog in the event that he or she swallows it. Purchase your doggy snacks from a specialist dog food outlet avoiding anything sweet. Gnaw sticks can be an important treat as they help with keeping the pet's teeth in excellent, clean condition. You should also not encourage your pet dog to have your own meals. They may position themselves using pleading eyes while looking at you eating your dinner but this behaviour should not be invited.

If you are providing a complete dry commercial dog food then at all times give a bowl filled with fresh, clear drinking water with each meal.

If you are unsure with regards to the type of foods your pet should be feeding on, or in case he or she looks overweight or under a healthy weight then consult with your vet who should be able to offer you guidance on serving sizes and protein levels needed by your particular breed.
