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Giving your dog an at-home bathtub can be easy with the proper preparation. The mandatory frequency of baths depends on the breed of your dog and other factors, like how much time the dog spends outdoors. Use logic: If your dog smells, provide it a bath. Typically, additional than two baths a month is taken into account excessive. If your dog has reoccurring odor issues or irritated skin, take into account calling a vet or consulting with a professional groomer.

Start by shampooing the tail and hind legs. Next, lather the body, front legs, underside and chest. Wet the face, ears and head last. Then, wash these areas, being careful not to get shampoo in your dog's eyes. Start the rinse in reverse order. Rinse the face 1st, then the body and then the back legs and tail. Build sure you get the shampoo off the dog's underside. You'll have to carry up its front legs to reach this area. Rinse thoroughly.
