# **What Are The Procedures For A Ringworm Dog?**

Dogs can acquire ringworm so called [ringworm dog](#) as can cats, animals and humans. Ringworm is a fungus infection that does affect the skin, hair or nails. The word ringworm has nothing to do with insects or worms and can look like a raised ring shaped rash. Other symptoms associated with ringworm is swelling, redness, itching and round patches of hair loss. To find the best solution with your present situation, it is best to seek the advice from your vet. By the way, it is hard to analyze the situation by just looking at the skin area. Your vet may decide to try to view the area with a black light. About fifty percent of M canis will glow when using the wood's lamp. The other method is to use a microscope to look at the skin or hair samples. The vet may want to grow a culture from the scraping of a lesion as well. When dealing with [ringworm dogs](#), the ringworm infection can be highly contagious.

Ringworm may be spread by contact with an infected surface, animal, other pets or people. Your dog might of contracted the infection from digging into infected fungus soil not to mention another infected dog, cat or human. Puppies who get ringworm can easily spread the infection to adult dogs and litter playmates. What happens with ringworm is that the ringworm fungus can take up residence in the dogs hair cells and the skin area causing the present patterns. The ringworm fungus does live off the keratin found in the dogs dead hair and skin which usually spreads outward from the source of the infection. A dog with a weak immune system or skin wounds are acceptable for ringworm.

Other skin problems like yeast infections, skin allergies and skin parasites have similar ringworm appearances. The quickest and easiest path for your [ringworm treatment](#) is to get a vets diagnosis. A medicated cream or ointment might be recommended or the use of a prescribe oral medication. As a reminder to follow the medicated directions with the proper time schedules. The veterinarian may also advise using a medicated shampoo to treat the fungus spores that live in the dogs fur.

Don't forget to use color-safe bleach and detergent to remove the ringworm (dermatophyte) spores from the dogs bedding, collars, dog cloths, toys etc. The fungus spores in your carpet areas may need vacuuming. Steam cleaning might be an alternative in severe cases for cleaning your home.
